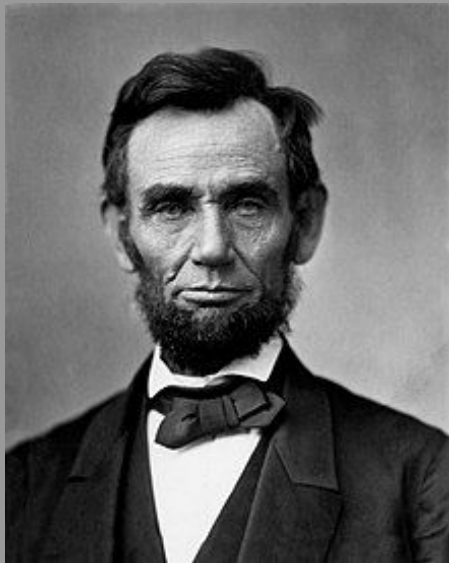


Frederick Douglass:

Abolitionist

Author/Orator who brought a voice to a voiceless population

Escaped slave who valued education

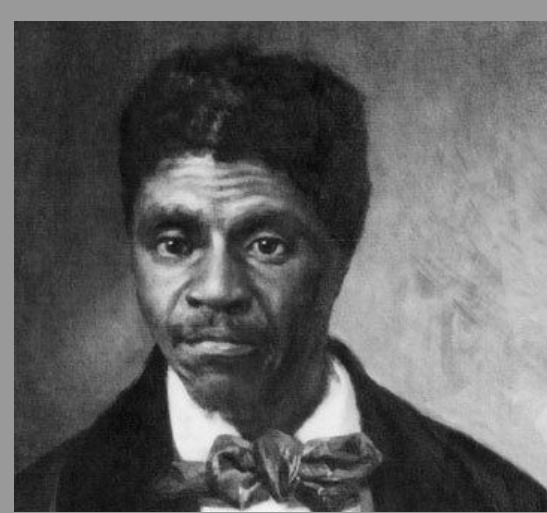


Abraham Lincoln:

Elected President of the United States 1860 and 1864: lead to the start of the Civil War because he promised "NO MORE slave states" (not the abolishment of slavery)

Delivered Emancipation Proclamation and Gettysburg Address
Assassinated by John Wilkes Booth in Ford's Theater April 1865

Legacy lead to the 13,14,15th Amendments

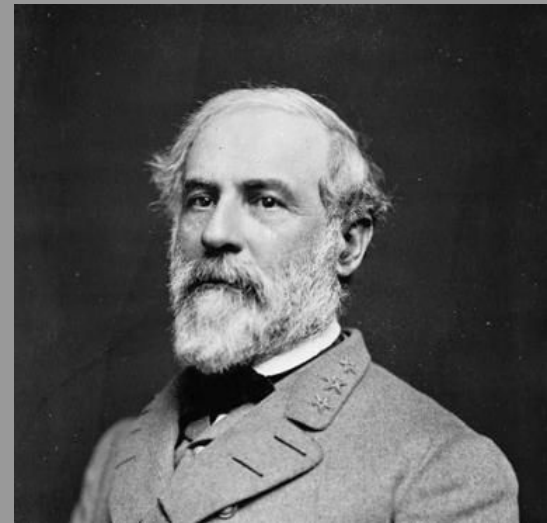


Dred Scott:

Legally a freeman however stayed with his master until his death, then sought freedom

Sued for his freedom and after 10 years the case went to the Supreme Court

The Court ruled that Scott was property and could not sue in the court of law



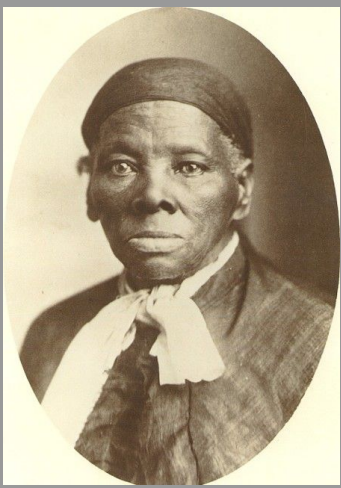
Robert E. Lee:

Virginian

Lead Confederate forces

Believed the Union should stay together but fought for his home

Surrendered to General Grant at Appomattox Court House to end the Civil War



Harriet Tubman:

Runaway Slave

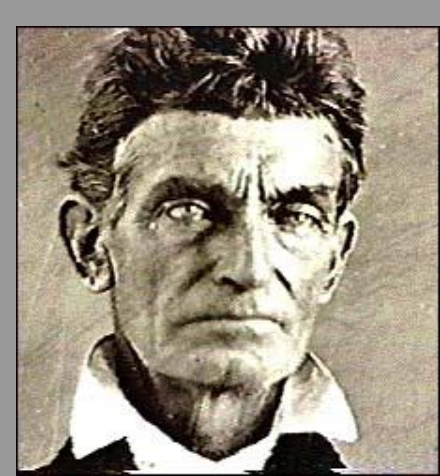
Worked on the Underground Railroad and liberated hundreds from slavery



Harriet Beecher Stowe:

Northern abolitionist

Author: Uncle Tom's Cabin - anti-slavery propaganda that depicted the life of a slave in the South under a cruel master



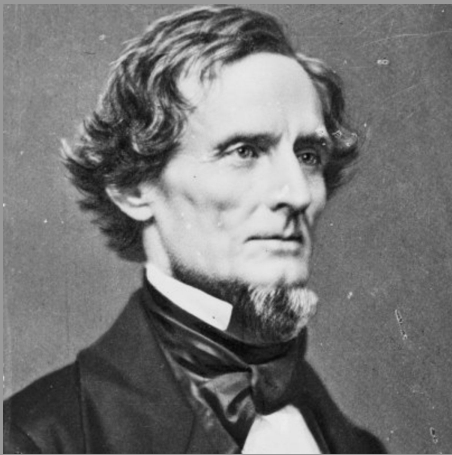
John Brown: :

Abolitionist

Believed he was on a mission from God

Contributed to the violence in Bleeding Kansas

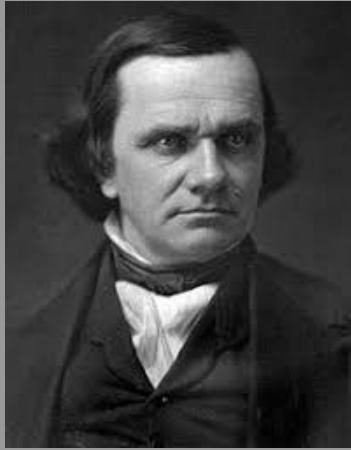
Tried to lead a slave revolt at Harpers Ferry Federal Arsenal - failed



Jefferson Davis:

First and only President of the Confederate States

Lead the country during the Civil War



Stephen Douglas:

Proposed the Kansas - Nebraska Act and introduced the idea of Popular Sovereignty: allowed for the citizens of a territory to vote on social/political issues



General Ulysses S. Grant:

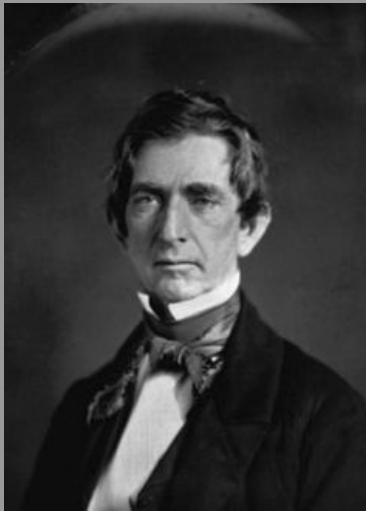
General for the Union Army
Would accept surrender with General Lee at Appomattox Court House

Elected President in 1869 during Reconstruction



54th Regiment of Massachusetts:

All black regiment who volunteered and fought for the Union during the Civil War



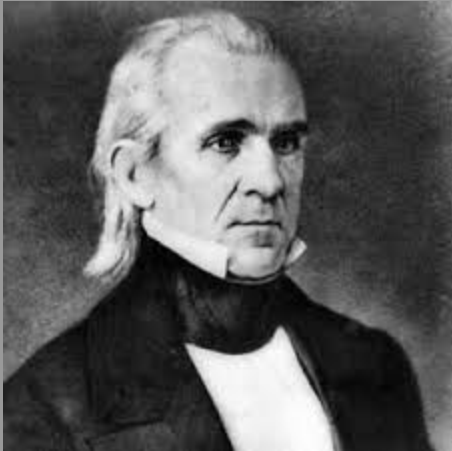
William Seward:

Purchased Alaska from the Russian Czar to further westward Expansion



Clara Barton:

Founded the Red Cross



President James Polk:

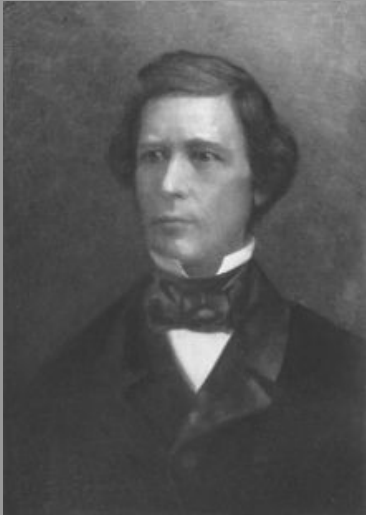
His Presidential policy for Westward Expansion would lead to Civil War

Andrew Jackson:

Jacksonian Democracy was a contributing factor to Civil War



David Wilmot:

His Wilmot Proviso tried to establish Texas/New Mexico/Arizona as free states - DID NOT PASS



Frances Clayton:

Hid her identity to serve in the Missouri Cavalry as Jack Williams



Sarah Seely Edmondson:

Hid her identity to serve in the Michigan Infantry as Frank Thompson



Nurse Susie King Taylor:

Served as a nurse for the Union Army



Sojourner Truth:

African American abolitionist and women's rights activist
